August 23, 1954 – September 13, 2021

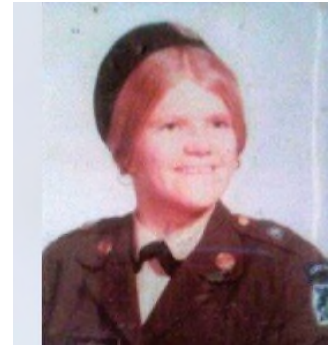

65th National Bivouac August 27, 2021

The 65th National Bivouac was called to order at 8:22 AM by National Director VIP, Cheri Shannon. The doors were secured for the memorial service. The acting Sky Pilot read a poem and asked attendees by Echelon to state the names of those who had passed during the last two years. A memorial prayer was given for the four (4) PNDs who had passed in the last two years. Responsive reading followed with the attendees responding, “We remember them.” The memorial service was closed, and the meeting room was opened for entry and exit.

- CQ Gigi Calloway-incoming CQ and assistant CQ are doing a great job. I want to thank everyone for working hard to make this Bivouac successful.
- Judge Advocate, send resolutions before the Bivouac
- Dispersing Director, no education applications submitted, no service applications submitted; service applicants can get up to \$500
- Jeep Editor, make note of deadline dates for 2021-2022. The dates are printed on refrigerator magnets that are inside Echelon 1’s goodie bag issued to Delegates. All elected officers for 2021-2022 will be listed in the October issue of The Jeep. Please do not send articles and pictured in “pdf” format. Call me with questions or concerns, cell (310) 293-1246, home (310) 819-8815. Remember, the Echelon’s Aide is responsible for getting The Jeep to members or can be accessed on the National website, www.twentyandfour.org Carol Reed is the webmaster. The December issue will include Holiday Greetings from the echelons. Remember to submit \$1 per Jeepette in your Echelon to the Disbursing Director. The February issue will include

application and information for applying for a scholarship. The Service Report form will be in the April issue with deadline and submission information. Any available information on the upcoming Bivouac will also be included in April. The June issue will include nominations of candidacy, the Call to Bivouac and information regarding hotel and Bivouac banquet. The late July issue will be a recap.

Disbursing Director, Judi Beischel, presented an honorary check to Director VIP and stated that elected officers would receive reimbursements from \$300 – \$500 by submitting their hotel bill. National Director, Cheri Stanton, stated that a gift card was sent to Joyce Babcock and asked that everyone keep her in prayer.

Marilyn Rideaux moved that up to \$650.00 be included in the annual budget for refreshments. CA-1 moved to amend budget for 2021-2022 to include \$650 for refreshments, second and passed unanimously.

MT-9 moved that budget be adjusted to include the \$650 (budget must be balanced), second and passed unanimously.

Moved and second that all manuals be updated. Motion carried.
