**CALL to 69th ANNUAL NATIONAL BIVOUAC
AUGUST 21 – 22, 2025
Tampa, Florida**

PURPOSE

- *To elect National Officers
- *To amend the National Constitution and Bylaws if necessary
- *To transact such business as necessary
- *To meet and enjoy one another's company

REPRESENTATION

The Bivouac shall be composed of delegates from all Echelons. Each Echelon shall be entitled to five (5) delegates and five alternates, plus one additional

delegate and alternate for each fifty (50) paid members. All Echelons that are in good standing by July 14, 2025, will be entitled to representation at the Bivouac. Members of the National Cadre from each Echelon shall be delegates to the National Bivouac with the right of the vote. This vote shall be exercised with their respective Echelons.

Echelons (all) 5 delegates and 5 alternates

50 + members 1 additional delegate and alternate

76 thru 125 members 2 additional delegates and alternates

DELEGATES

Only paid-up members for the year 2025 are entitled to be a member of the Cadre, a Delegate or Alternate Delegate to the Bivouac. A member is paid up when \$13.00 per capita for the current year has been received by the National Aide 40 days (July 14, 2025) prior to the National Bivouac. No per capita will be accepted for Bivouac count after that date nor will any Jeepette be listed on the Bivouac registry or receive a Bivouac badge.

CREDENTIALS

Blank forms will be furnished to all Echelon Aides. The credentials form (Delegate/Alternate Registration Form) must be returned to the National Aide by August 6, 2025. Accompanying the Credential form shall be a check in payment as per this schedule: \$10.00 for the Echelon and \$5.00 for each Jeepette listed on the form. If a Jeepette is deemed to be filling more than one position, do not list her twice. She is to be listed ONLY IN THE HIGHEST POSITION. That is: Past National Director, Current National Officer, National Cadre Member, Echelon Delegate and finally, Alternate Delegate. ALL positions require \$5.00 for each Jeepette listed.

Delegate/Alternate Delegate badges will be issued at the Bivouac for all Jeepettes registered. In extenuating circumstances, registration corrections may be made by the National Aide and Echelon Officers must be present. The Echelon must have been registered and fees paid PRIOR to arrival at Bivouac.

Tweila-Rochelle Cauthen, Sky Pilot

On 5 May 1866, in Waterloo, NY, a ceremony was held to decorate graves of the soldiers that had died during the War Between the Confederate States and the United States of America (The Civil War). One hundred years later, Congress and President Lyndon B. Johnson declared that Waterloo, NY is the official "birthplace" of Memorial Day.

Currently services are held nationwide in May, culminating on the last Monday of the month as the federal observance of Memorial Day.

Our National Director, Mildred Wright Pearson, National Sky Pilot and others, participated in the wreath laying ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery, followed by festivities at the Military Women's Memorial.

It is reported that 543 of the approximately 350,000 women that served during World War II died in war-related incidents, and yes...16 were nurses that died from enemy fire.

What happened to THEIR stories? Buried, because women were not recognized as permanent members of the Armed Forces until 1948.

Women have served as an integral part of the military (albeit illegally), since the Revolutionary War.

Let us NEVER forget our Sisters In Arms. Continue to aid and comfort our women veterans and active duty servicemembers. Visit a base and drop a few gift cards...or go donate time or items to the USO. Homeless shelters and VA hospitals are always grateful for donations of resources and your time.

Remember, stop grumbling about a problem when YOU could be the solution.



Service Volunteering

Considering how you're going to use your volunteers is just as important as the project you choose.

* **Keep 'em busy.** People want to be involved, and there's nothing more frustrating for a volunteer than leaving an event feeling like they didn't accomplish anything. Make sure you consider the different ages, skill levels and abilities of your volunteers. Have something for everyone! If possible, make sure your event is family friendly. If that's not feasible, communicate the age restriction.

* **Have a backup plan.** What happens if more or fewer volunteers show up? Can you scale to accommodate both scenarios? Is your event dependent on the weather, and if so, do you have an alternate date or location?

* **Anticipate people's needs** during your event. As you plan, think through the supplies and materials you need to have on hand for your project. Will volunteers be able to show up and accomplish the goal you've set? Also, don't forget details like restroom access, parking and safety considerations.

* **Communicate ahead of the event** any special instructions people will need to know. Is there specific attire they should wear or bring (garden gloves, work clothes, etc.)?

* **Make sure each person records their time on our Service Sheet** We want to show veterans the impact we can have when we all come together.

3. **Interest.** The more thoughts you put in to keeping your volunteers happy and engaged, the more they're going to want to come back for other events.

* **Set a time limit** (or shifts) of no more than three hours for your event. You want people to leave feeling accomplished but not completely wiped out. Shorter events hold people's interest more and allows for them to more easily fit into their schedules.

* **Never pass on an opportunity** to say thank you to volunteers. The most precious resource anyone can give is their time. Not only should you be a good steward of that time, but making people feel seen and appreciated will all but guarantee they'll be back to help in future events.

4. **Information.** What you say is just as important as what you do. Do people understand the impact they're making or what Twenty & Four is about?

* **Take the time** at your event to share the mission of Twenty & Four and the services it provides. Events like VAMC Homeless Events and Stand Downs are great touchpoints to connect veterans to our organization—both for services they need and for growing our membership ranks. Those who aren't eligible for membership can learn about the benefits.

* **Remind people** that they don't need to be a veteran to volunteer with Twenty & Four. Share with them other opportunities to serve veterans—whether through the Department of Veterans Affairs or through your Echelon.

* **Stay in touch** with event attendees. Send out email newsletters or regular posts on social media about what your Echelon is up to. Volunteers are more likely to stay involved if you demonstrate your consistent and activeness in your community.

Visit veterans in area nursing homes in your area, ask the women are they veterans and make it a regular event for them. Consider holiday meals, claims assistance clinics, and information tables at state veterans homes.

When we volunteer our time, we're showing our veterans and injured veterans and their families that "thank you for your service" is more than just words; it's action. Keep up the great work.

This is huge that they are providing this to honor our female Veterans. Our members deserve to go to Washington to see our memorials. You can apply on line. Search HonorFlight.org for a hub near you. It's the only memorial dedicated expressly to female Veterans.
